NEWS AND NOTES

THE SERIES

Saturday's game will mark the 82nd meeting between Columbia and Dartmouth with the Big Green having won the last two meetings. Dartmouth leads the all-time series 63-17-1. Columbia last defeated Dartmouth in 2008, a 21-13 win in a torrential downpour at Robert K. Kraft Field.

LAST TIME OUT FOR COLUMBIA

Columbia tied the game at 20-20 late in the fourth quarter but Penn scored with 25 seconds remaining to defeat the Lions 27-20.

LAST TIME OUT FOR DARTMOUTH

Senior Nick Schwieger rushed for his 12th career 100+ yard game, but Dartmouth fell short in the comeback, losing to Holy Cross 25-17.

BRACKETT PASSING GREATS

Junior QB Sean Brackett is now tied for second place in the Columbia record book with 31 touchdown passes in his career. Brackett is now tied with Jeff McCall '02 and sits behind John Witkowski '84, who threw 56 touchdown passes in his career, on the school's all-time list.

MORE FOR MORAND

Senior Ross Morand had 12 solo tackles vs. Penn, a career-high. For his efforts Morand was named the John Toner Columbia Homecoming Player of the Game.

ZACH ATTACK

Zach Olinger is tied for eighth in the Ivy League with 42 tackles on the year, and average of 8.4 per game. A.J. Maddox is tied for 22nd. Olinger also ranks second in the League in forced fumbles with two.

MARTIN STANDING TALL

Josh Martin ranks third in the Ivy League in sacks with four and a half, and 11th in tackles for a loss with four. Martin has gotten his hands on four pass attempts, has four quarterback hurries and a blocked field goal to his credit.

MURPHY'S LAW

Ryan Murphy leads the League in fumbles recovered with two. The junior linebacker has started all five games and also has registered a team-high six tackles for a loss this season.

HAMILTON HAULS IT IN

Sophomore tight end Hamilton Garner has caught a touchdown pass from Sean Brackett in each of Columbia's last three games. Against Penn, Garner made a 16-yard scoring catch to put the Lions ahead 17-10 in the third quarter. A week before vs. Sacred Heart, Garner caught two touchdown passes and now has four scores on the year.

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HAUSCHILDT NAMED SEMIFINALIST FOR NFF NATIONAL SCHOLAR-ATHLETE AWARD

Columbia senior football captain Bob Hauschildt was named a semifinalist for the 2011 National Football Foundation National Scholar-Athlete Awards, presented by Fidelity Investments®, a leading provider of not-for-profit workplace retirement savings plans in higher education. Last year, Hauschildt was awarded the Class of 1913 Football Cup, awarded annually to the member of the Columbia football squad, in his junior or senior season, who achieves the best scholastic average. Hauschildt is a two-year starter on the Lions' offensive line and was chosen as one of four captains prior to the start of the 2011 campaign.

HAMBLIN IS 2011 NFF NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLAR-ATHLETE

The National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF) announced that Columbia defensive back Tyler Hamblin is one of five winners of the 2011 NFF National High School Scholar-Athlete Awards with each recipient selected as the best of the best from their region of the country at the high school level. Selected from the 400,000 high school football players covered by the NFF Chapter Network, Hamblin, who played his high school ball at Cretin-Derham in Minneapolis, Minn., is the Midwest Region winner. He will be honored for his high school accomplishments during the NFF Chapter Awards Luncheon Tuesday, December 6 at the Waldorf-Astoria in New York City.

YOU SHALL NOW PASS

Junior quarterback Sean Brackett ranks fourth in the Ivy League in passing yards per game, averaging 198.4 yards per contest this season. Brackett has thrown eight touchdown passes this season to four different receivers. Brackett is also third in total offense in the Ivy League at 242 yards per game.

SPREADING THE WEALTH

Fourteen different Lions have made at least one reception during the season. Senior wideout Kurt Williams leads the pack with 23 receptions for 325 yards this season.

NUMBER EIGHT IS GREAT

The 23 receptions by Kurt Williams ranks fifth among all Ivy League wide receivers. Williams also ranks sixth in the league in receiving yards per game.

MARVELOUS MARCORUS

Sophomore running back has found the end zone in each of the last two weeks. On October 8 vs. Sacred Heart, Garrett scored on a 16-yard rush that put the Lions on the board. On Oct. 15 vs. Penn, Garrett also scored Columbia's first touchdown of the game, a two-yard plunge that put the Lions ahead 10-0.

EDDY MONEY

Columbia sophomore kicker Luke Eddy drilled a pair of field goals in a stiff wind vs. Penn last week. Eddy made a 31-yarder to get the Lions on the board in the first quarter then nailed a pressure-packed, 35-yard field goal late in the fourth quarter.

The Lions' defense has come up big on fourth down plays this year. The Lions are first in the Ivy League in opponents' fourth-down conversions, only allowing two first downs in nine tries by their opposition.

ARCHIE ROBERTS, NFF DISTINGUISHED AMERICAN

In July, the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF) announced that Dr. Archie Roberts, a prominent heart surgeon who played football at Columbia in the 1960s, has been named the 2011 recipient of the organization's Distinguished American Award. First bestowed in 1966, the NFF Distinguished American Award is presented on special occasions when a truly deserving candidate emerges. Roberts will become the 40th recipient of the award, joining an impressive list of previous honorees that includes Vince Lombardi, Bob Hope, Jimmy Stewart, Pete Rozelle, Joe Paterno, Pat Tillman, T. Boone Pickens and last year's honoree Tom Brokaw.

TRANSIT UPDATE

Game 1 • Fordham 21, Columbia 14

In a game with eight sacks between the two teams, and outstanding defensive plays on both sides, it was Fordham's 100-yard interception for a touchdown that proved to be the key play of the game.

Columbia's defense put on a show of their own, holding Fordham scoreless after two trips inside Columbia's 30-yard line. Seyi Adebayo and Owen Fraser combined for a tackle for a loss and a big sack respectively on Fordham's second possession in the first quarter, which turned the ball over to Columbia on downs.

On the ensuing drive, Fordham's Andre Delaire picked off Columbia's Sean Brackett to the Columbia 20, but Fordham's first penalty pushed them back to the 30 for an illegal block in the back. This time it was Zach Olinger and Adebayo that combined to keep Fordham off the scoreboard. Adebayo sacked the Rams' freshman quarterback Peter Maetzold for a loss of nine yards on third and seven from the Columbia 14 yard line. Fordham attempted a 40-yard field goal that went wide right.

Columbia took advantage of a Fordham penalty to close the first quarter. Patrick Murray's punted from the Fordham 19 but the Rams were called for interference, which put the Lions on the Rams 33 yard line.

Brackett found Mike Stephens, one of two Columbia receivers to have over 100 yards receiving on the day, for a 19-yard gain and put the Lions on the Fordham 14. Two plays later, Brackett found Kurt Williams for the score. Williams also had more than 100 yards receiving on the day. Luke Eddy converted the PAT for the 7-0 lead.

After consecutive three and out series by both teams, Columbia's defense held the Rams scoreless after starting a drive on the Columbia 35. Neil Schuster, Mike Waller, Olinger, and A.J. Maddox combined for tackles on the drive. Josh Martin blocked the 41-yard field goal attempt to give Columbia the ball on its own 32.

The Lions pushed the ball down the field behind a combined 42-yards receiving by Stephens and some short gains on the ground by Brackett. On second and goal from the Fordham six, Brackett was sacked for a loss of seven but on the next play, Brackett used some tough moves and kept for 11 yards. On fourth and two, Nick Womack picked Brackett at the goal line and raced 100 yards to tie the game.

"We talked all week about limited unforced turnovers," Patricia and Shepard Alexander Head Coach of Football Norries Wilson said. "We didn't do that today, and we have a lot to work on before next week."

Fordham scored the go-ahead touchdown on its second possession of the third. Starting the drive on its own 35, Maetzold found Sam Ajala for a 60-yard touchdown score to go up 14-7 midway through the third quarter.

After Columbia drove down to the Fordham 18 and failed to convert a field goal, Fordham tacked on another score early in the fourth on five plays, which spanned 80 yards. Maetzold connected with Carlton Koonce for a 16-yard touchdown pass.

Columbia cut the lead to 21-14 late in the fourth when Brackett led the Lions 48 yards on nine plays, culminating in a 10-yard Brackett-to-Stephens touchdown pass.

Brackett finished 18-32-2 for 239 yards and two touchdowns. Stephens finished with a career-high 105 yards on eight catches and a touchdown. Williams totaled 104 yards on six catches and a score.

Maetzold was 22-30 for 212 yards and two touchdowns.

Columbia's defense, which played extremely well throughout the game, was led by Olinger who led all players with nine solo tackles and 12 total tackles, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Marin had six tackles, one sack and one tackle for a loss, while Adebayo added four tackles, which included one sack and three tackles for a loss. Healthy of for the first time in a year, Frasier had four tackles with a huge sack and a tackle for a loss.

Game 3 • Princeton 24, Columbia 21

PRINCETON, N.J. - Princeton used 227 yards of rushing offense to defeat Columbia 24-21 at Princeton Stadium. The loss snaps Columbia's two-game win streak vs. the Tigers.

Princeton got on the board first, driving 61 yards on its first possession of the game for a field goal. Despite one fumble on Columbia's first drive, Columbia's defense helped put the Lions on the board when senior A.J. After a couple of three-and-outs by both teams, Princeton pinned Columbia in its own five-yard line, and took advantage of the ensuing good field position after a Columbia punt. Princeton went 26 yards in five plays to make it 24-14, which was the score at the end of the period.

Columbia fought back and scored midway through the fourth, driving 85 yards in eight plays, culminating in a 29-yard pass to Hamilton Garner to make the score 21-24.

As the game wound down, Columbia got a huge stop, halting Princeton on fourth and two from the Columbia two yard line, with less than 30 seconds remaining, but Columbia's final drive came up short.

Game 4 • Sacred Heart 34, Columbia 25

NEW YORK - Columbia led 13-6 late in the second quarter but Sacred Heart evened the score with 47 seconds left in the half and found the end zone on its first two drives of the second half to take a 27-13 lead. The Pioneers eventually held on for a 34-25 victory over the Lions on Robert K. Kraft Field behind 371 yards of passing and three touchdowns by Tim Little.

After Sacred Heart took an early 3-0 lead on a 32-yard field goal by Chris Rogers, Columbia's first play from scrimmage was a 20-yard gallop by Brackett to the Sacred Heart 35. The Lions eventually moved the ball to the 16-yard line and Marcus Garrett scored his first collegiate touchdown to put Columbia ahead 6-3 as Luke Eddy's extra point attempt went wide left.

Columbia's defense stuffed Sacred Heart on a fourth and one at the Lions' 11-yard line on the next possession after a 64-yard drive as Columbia regained possession on downs.

On Sacred Heart's next possession, the Columbia defense held strong again deep in its own territory. The Pioneers had first and goal on the five-yard line and Little completed a pass to Garry Coles that moved the ball to the one. After an incomplete pass on second down, Neil Schuster and Josh Martin stuffed Greg Moore on the one to bring up fourth down. Rogers then converted an 18-yard chip shot that tied the score at 6-6.

Later in the second quarter, Columbia was boosted by a 22-yard punt return by Alec Fisher that gave Columbia possession at the Sacred Heart 38. On third and one from the 29, Brackett dove ahead for the first down, then completed an 11-yard pass to Kurt Williams that moved the ball to the Sacred Heart 17. Brackett then rolled right and found Garner all alone in the back of the end zone to put the Lions on top, 13-6.

Sacred Heart got the ball back with 1:48 left and took advantage of good field position to start its drive at the Columbia 41. Little found Rich Rossi on a crossing pattern and Rossi scored the first of his two touchdowns, a 28-yard play, that tied the game at 13 heading into halftime.

The Pioneers forced a three and out on Columbia's first drive of the second half and then deflected Paul Delaney's punt that resulted in a net of three yards. Taking over at the Columbia 38, it took Sacred Heart just three plays to move ahead 20-13 on a one-yard plunge by Little.

Sacred Heart forced another three and out on the Lions' next possession and then completed a seven-play, 54-yard drive that ended on a pass from Little to Garry Coles for 27 yards that put the Pioneers up 27-13 midway through the third quarter.

Columbia responded on its next possession, started on an 18-yard run by Nick Gerst. The key play came on a 30-yard pass by Brackett to Williams that gave Columbia the ball at the nine-yard line. Two plays later, Gerst slipped through the line and scored from three yards out to bring the Lions within eight at 27-19 after Eddy's extra point was blocked.

The score remained that way at the start of the fourth quarter, when Sacred Heart gained possession at its 20-yard line. The Pioneers converted a pair of key third downs on the drive and Little found Rossi for the second time in the end zone, on a 12-yard play, to put the visitors ahead 34-19.

Columbia got closer with 2:34 to play when Brackett and Garner connected again on a 19-yard strike, but the Lions' point after try failed for the third time in the game, which remained a two-possession spread.

Game 5 • Penn 27, Columbia 20

NEW YORK - Columbia tied the game at 20-20 with 1:31 remaining in regulation but Penn took advantage of good field position to start its final drive and took five plays to go 56 yards to take a 27-20 lead with 25 seconds remaining as the Quakers came away with a seven-point victory on Columbia's Homecoming Day.

Columbia got on the board first late in the first quarter. The Lions began their drive at their own 39-yard line. With the ball on the Columbia 48, Lion quarterback Sean Brackett found Louis DiNovo over the middle for a long catch and run that went for 41 yards deep into Penn territory.

Luke Eddy then nailed a 31-yard field goal to give Columbia a 3-0 lead at the end of the first quarter.

With 13:09 left in the second quarter, Penn started its drive on its 24-yard line. Greg Schuster carried on first and ten and was stripped of the ball by defensive back Kalasi Huggins who snatched the ball away in one motion and took it 11 yards down the field to put Columbia in position to score again.

Three plays later, Columbia punched it in the end zone when Marcorus Garrett scored for the second straight game, on a two-yard run to make it 10-0 Columbia.

Penn's Connor Loftus converted a 35-yard field goal midway through the second quarter and got the ball at its own 33-yard line with 1:30 left in the half down 10-3.

The Quakers quickly moved down the field and on third and goal from the eight, Billy Ragone passed to Ryan Calvert and Marquel Carter stopped Calvert a yard short of the goal line, leaving Penn to decide whether to kick a field goal or attempt a tying touchdown before the half ended.

With seven seconds left, Penn elected to go for it on fourth and goal and Ragone plunged into the end zone to ultimately tie the game 10-10 at halftime.

After deferring to receive in the second half, Columbia got the ball to begin the third quarter. After starting its drive on the 34-yard line, Sean Brackett completed two consecutive passes to DiNovo that moved the ball into Penn territory.

Brackett then found Kurt Williams on a post pattern that went for 31 yards, moving the ball to the 16-yard line. On the next play, Brackett executed a perfect option fake and found Hamilton Garner wide open down the middle to put Columbia back in front, 17-10.

Later in the third quarter, a Penn interception set up the Quakers near midfield. Penn moved into the red zone but the Columbia defense stiffened, setting up a 36-yard field goal by Loftus that cut the Columbia lead to 17-13.

After a Columbia three and out, Penn completed a nine-play, 82-yard drive that ended in a Brandon Colavita three-yard score. The touchdown gave Penn its first lead of the game, 20-17, with 10:57 remaining.

Columbia began its final scoring drive of the game on its 11-yard line with 6:06 remaining in the fourth quarter. Brackett completed three passes and rushed for 25 yards to put the ball at the Penn 35.

After three straight incomplete passes, Columbia had to go for it on fourth and 10 from the 35. After a Columbia timeout and then a Penn timeout, Brackett fired down the middle to find Williams, who made a terrific catch in traffic for a 24-yard gain.

With the ball at the Penn 11, Brackett rushed for seven yards down to the four-yard line. The Lions then committed three penalties and after two incomplete passes, were forced to try a 35-yard field goal with the wind in kicker Luke Eddy's face.

Eddy drilled the 35-yarder that split the uprights, tying the game at 20-20 as the spirited Homecoming crowd at Wien Stadium got even louder.

Penn then received a short kickoff at the 40-yard line and returned it back to its own 44. The Quakers' first play resulted in a pass interference call and Ragone then found Calvert for a six-yard gain. Ragone and Calvert connected again on the next play, a 26-yard strike down the middle that moved the ball to the Columbia 10.

On third and goal from the seven, Ragone called his own number and went into the end zone to put Penn ahead for good, 27-20.

Ragone passed for 185 yards and scored two touchdowns on the ground. Brackett passed for 218 yards and rushed for 38 yards.

Calvert caught eight balls for 105 yards while Williams made five grabs for 86 yards.

Patricia and Shepard Alexander Head Coach of Football **NORRIES WILSON**

Norries Wilson begins his sixth year as Columbia's Patricia and Shepard Alexander Head Coach of Football after the Lions posted four or more wins in consecutive seasons for the first time since 1997-98.

Wilson, one of the top assistant coaches in the nation while at the University of Connecticut, became Columbia's 18th head coach of football in December 2005.

Wilson's student-athletes have earned 28 All-Ivy League honors since 2006, including two Rookies of the Year and 11 first-team selections.

After a 4-6, 2-5 Ivy League season in 2010, Columbia had a total of eight student-athletes named All-Ivy League in football, the second most in school history. Among the eight, five (Sean Brackett, Alex Gross, Andrew Kennedy, Calvin Otis, and Jeff Adams) were named to the first team, the most since 1994.

Brackett became Columbia's first quarterback since Jamie Schwalbe (1994) to be named first team All-Ivy League.

In 2009, Wilson led Columbia to a fourth-place finish in the Ivy League, the Lions' best league finish in six years. Columbia also posted its most wins in six years. Eight Columbians were named to the All-Ivy League team, including defensive end Lou Miller, a unanimous first team selection, along with fellow first-teamers Austin Knowlin (wide receiver) and Jeff Adams (offensive lineman).

Wilson, who served as offensive coordinator at UConn for four seasons, was one of five finalists for the Frank Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach in 2004, a season in which the Huskies led the Big East in both total and scoring offense. In 2003, he guided UConn's offense that posted 477.5 yards per game, which ranked eighth in the nation.

In 2002, Wilson was promoted to the Huskies' offensive coordinator after joining the UConn staff in 1999 as offensive line coach. He continued to work specifi-

cally with the Huskies' centers and guards. In 2004, UConn defeated Toledo to win the Motor City Bowl. Three members of that team's offense went on to sign National Football League contracts.

Prior to the 2004 season, Wilson was one of 12 coaches selected to participate in the NCAA Expert Coaching Program. The program is designed to teach and reinforce various aspects of securing, managing and excelling in NCAA head coaching positions at the Division I-A level.

Before UConn, Wilson spent four seasons at Bucknell. He was the Bison's offensive line coach in 1995 and 1996 before a promotion to offensive coordinator in 1997 and 1998. He was also defensive coordinator at Livingstone College (1993), offensive line/tight ends coach at North Carolina Central (1991-92) and graduate assistant at his alma mater, the University of Minnesota (1989-90).

Wilson was a captain and two-year starter for the Gophers. In 1985, the team defeated Clemson to win the Independence Bowl and competed in the Liberty Bowl vs. Tennessee the following year. He was a three-year letterwinner in football, and earned two letters and qualified for the NCAA Championships as a heavyweight in wrestling. He graduated from Minnesota in 1989 with a degree in psychology.

In addition to his college coaching experience, Wilson has served minority coaching fellowships in the NFL with the Kansas City Chiefs (1992), the Jacksonville Jaguars (1995) and the Indianapolis Colts (2000).

A native of Markham Ill., where he attended Thornwood High School, Wilson is married to the former Brenda Marquis, who played forward on UConn's first women's basketball national championship team. The couple has three children: a son, Cecil, and two daughters, Trinity and Sahara.
